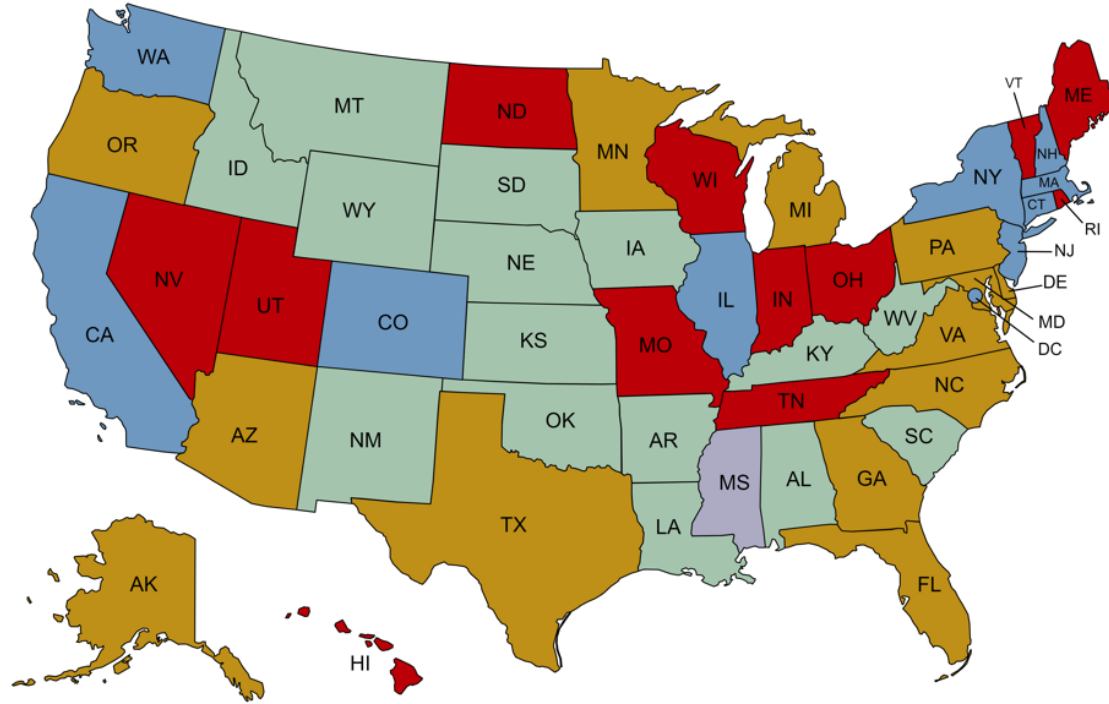

The average annual wage in Rhode Island’s private sector averaged \$64,435 in 2023, the 26th highest annual wage in the nation. Rhode Island’s 2023 annual wage was 11.3 percent less than the national average of \$72,609. Across the country, the private sector annual wage averaged from a high of \$112,087 in the District of Columbia to a low of \$48,363 in Mississippi. Within New England, Rhode Island had the fourth highest annual wage, trailing Massachusetts (\$93,013), Connecticut (\$84,947) and New Hampshire (\$76,038). Annual wages in Vermont and Maine averaged \$61,441 and \$60,565, respectively.
